Wooroloo Sanatorium:

Wooroloo Sanatorium 1915

Wooroloo Sanatorium, in the Darling Ranges of Western Australia, was established by the State Government in response to the infectious diseases, such as typhoid, diphtheria, and tuberculosis that was widely prevalent in the aftermath of the mass migration that came as a result of the gold rushes in Western Australia in the early part of the twentieth century. The official opening was on the 1st of May 1915. Emphasis was placed on the treatment of tuberculosis through the provision of fresh air and sunlight. Patients with silicosis were relocated from the Coolgardie Sanatorium to Wooroloo when the Coolgardie sanatorium was closed down. The Coolgardie Sanatorium was the first sanatorium in Western Australia to treat TB Patients.

By the 1960s, the sanatorium was no longer required and the institution was operated as a geriatric and a district hospital. The Wooroloo Sanatorium was subsequently converted to a minimum security prison for short-term offenders after the Prisons Department officially acquired the site in April 1970.

The former sanatorium itself occupies a band of land between the Great Eastern Highway and the pipeline for the Goldfields Water Supply. It stands on the slopes of Beechina Hill above the Linley Valley and Wooroloo Creek.

The Wooroloo Cemetery is located midway between the former sanatorium and the township of Wooroloo.

The above link will also take you to a website that has photographs of the headstones in the Wooroloo Cemetery. The Cemetery has the burials of 78 Goldfields people. They would have been sent to the sanatorium for treatment and many died there never having seen their families again.

Postal Auction No 185

The number of lots in the auction was 214, of those 147 sold. A significant number of cards also sold on the club table at reserve prices. As usual the W, A. lots led the charge.

Lot No1 "Bevilaquas Clothing Emporium" in Albany (with staff standing outside on what was probably an exciting day for them) was a notable lot. I have noticed in the past, a number of cards published for newsagents or booksellers in country towns. I was reminded of a Tucks series of BW views of Wagin and Narrogin. As far as I am aware these featured the towns railway line etc. None, as far as I recall, showed the shop front of the owner responsible for the publication. Other than city stores like Boans and Foys, I can only think of one other shop front, Mazzucchellis, on a card from Coolgardie. If there are more, it would be interesting to know.

I am aware of a number of military type cards showing soldiers from Albany. It seems the town was an active base at times. Lot No. 2, of Soldiers on Empire Day sold.

All the lots of Fremantle W.A. sold. Lot 24 was a Kodak print, possibly an amateur photo. The family album was practically guaranteed a good shot with Kodak Film.

The Trans Australia lots didn't sell.

Artists Gill, Oouthwaite, Tarrant, Mercer, Hine, Mansell, Turner (No 34) and Mac (Lucy Dawson) sold. David Low, a British WW2 cartoonist, did not sell. He was one of very few WW2 artists that featured Hitler. At the time, Low was a newspaper artist.

The BW photos of different dog breeds sold; the cats missed out.

Royalty is still popular. The current photos that are selling depict senior members of European Royalty and are likely to increase in value as time goes by.

Song cards and Tasmania sold. Scotland, Gibraltar, Mexico and Trinidad did not attract interest.

Lot 15 Byrd Antarctic Exploration sold- Antarctic exploration captured people's imagination and featured in magazines and books, as a result, the postcards very popular and expensive.


