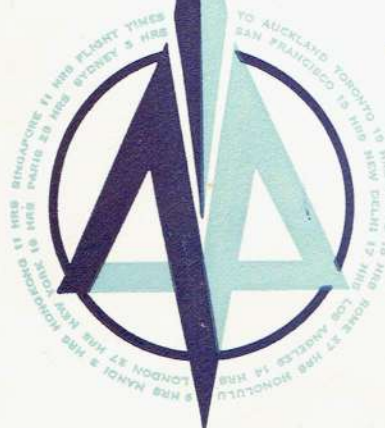

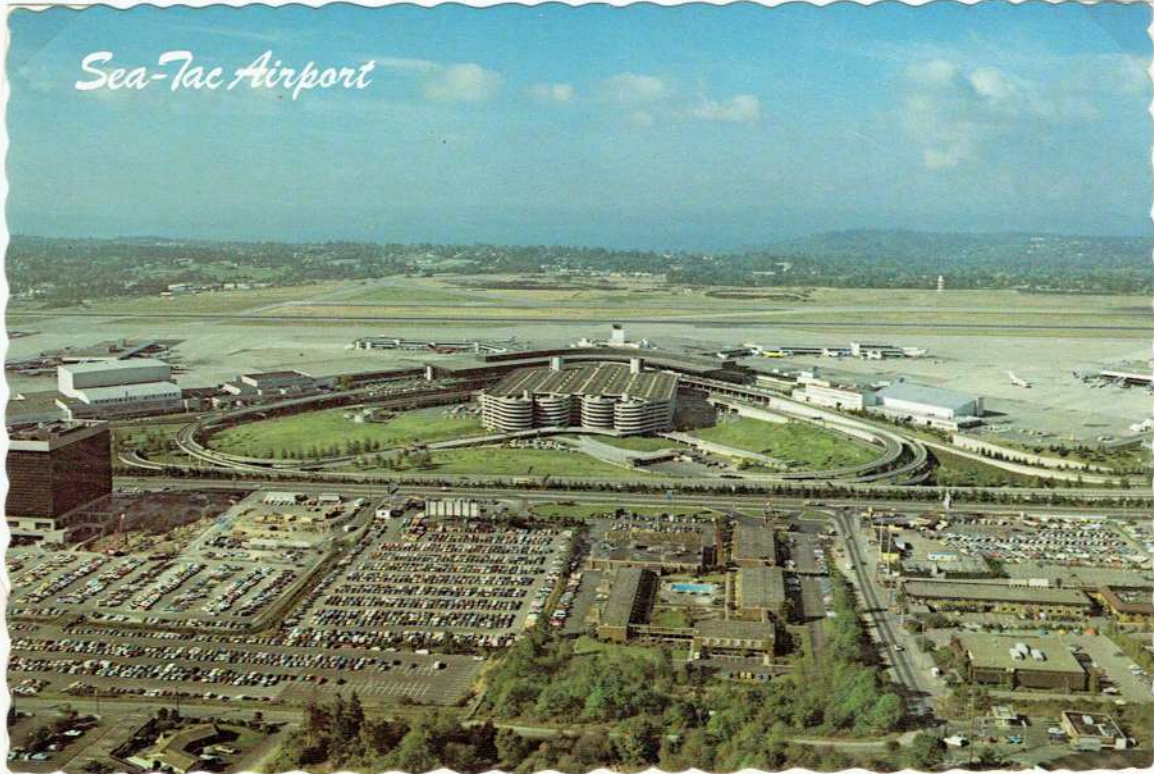

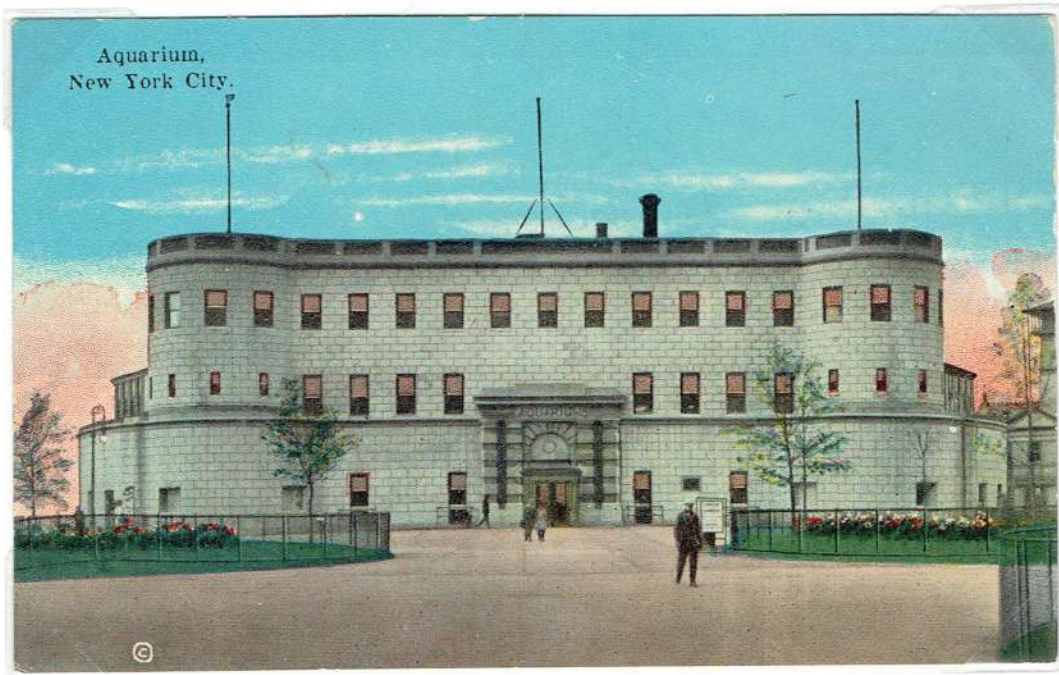

# CASTLE GARDEN

LOT 84

BUILT AS FORT CLINTON TO DEFEND THE CITY AGAINST THE BRITISH IN THE WAR OF 1812. CONVERTED TO A PLACE OF AMUSEMENT IN 1822. IN 1835, MORSE DEMONSTRATED HIS TELEGRAPH HERE. IN 1850 JENNY LIND THE "SWEDISH NIGHTINGALE" MADE HER AMERICAN DEBUT UNDER THE MANAGEMENT OF P.T. BARNUM. THE BUILDING WAS OPENED AS AN AQUARIUM IN 1896.

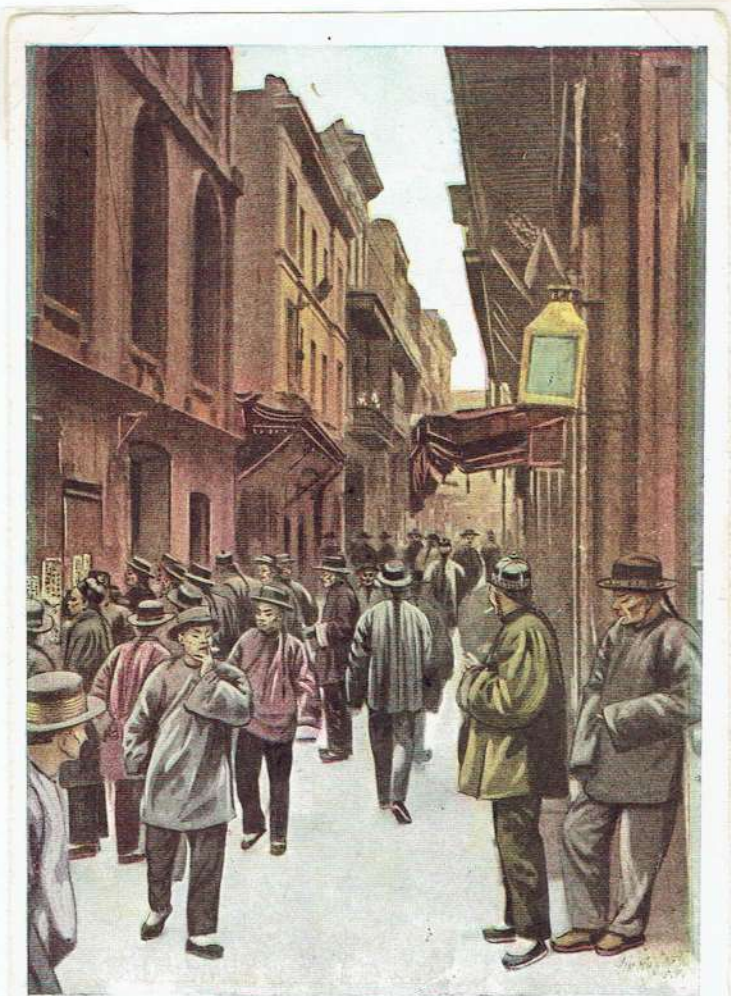

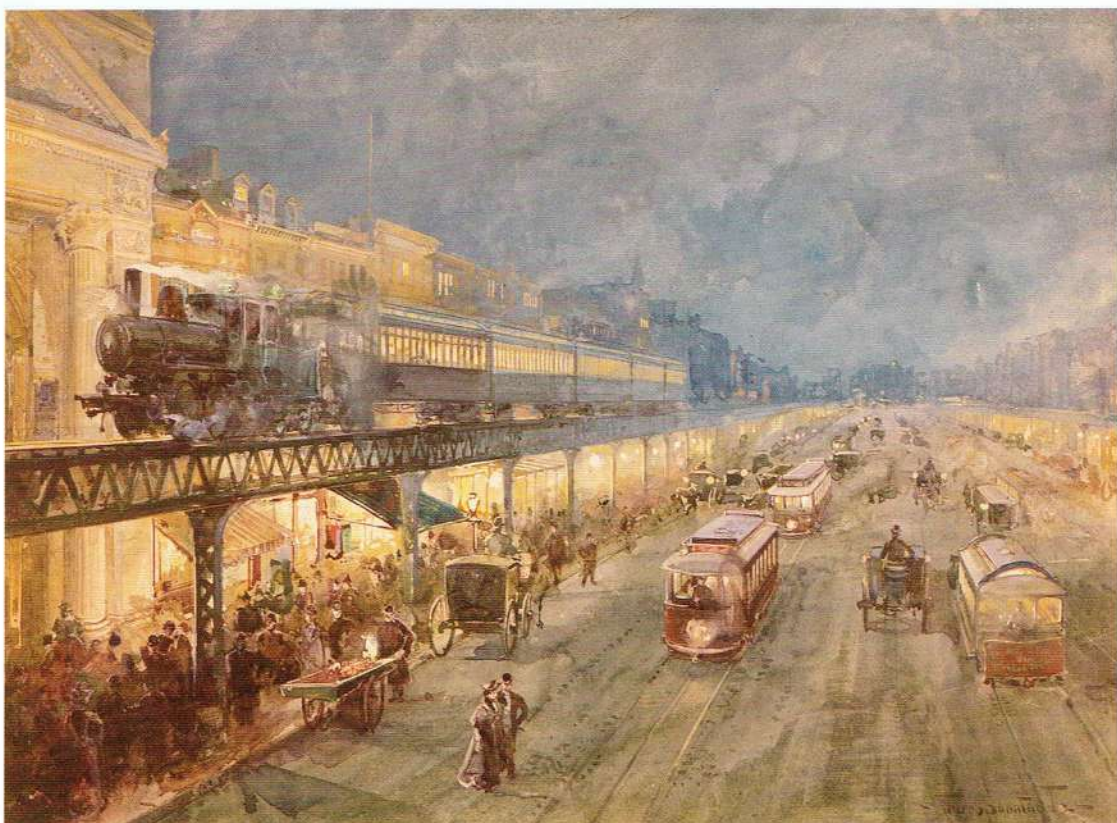

NAMED BECAUSE TWO MAIN ROADS CONVERGED HERE . IN THE EARLY 20<sup>th</sup> CENTURY THE SQUARE BECAME A RALLYING SPOT FOR LABOUR PROTESTS AND MASS DEMONSTRATIONS ; MANY UNIONS AS WELL AS FRINGE POLITICAL PARTIES MOVED THEIR HEADQUARTERS INTO THE AREA .

OVER THE YEARS THE AREA DETERIORATED INTO A HABITAT OF DRUG DEALERS AND KINDRED UNDESIRABLES, UNTIL A MASSIVE RENEWAL PROGRAM IN THE 1980s TRANSFORMED IT.

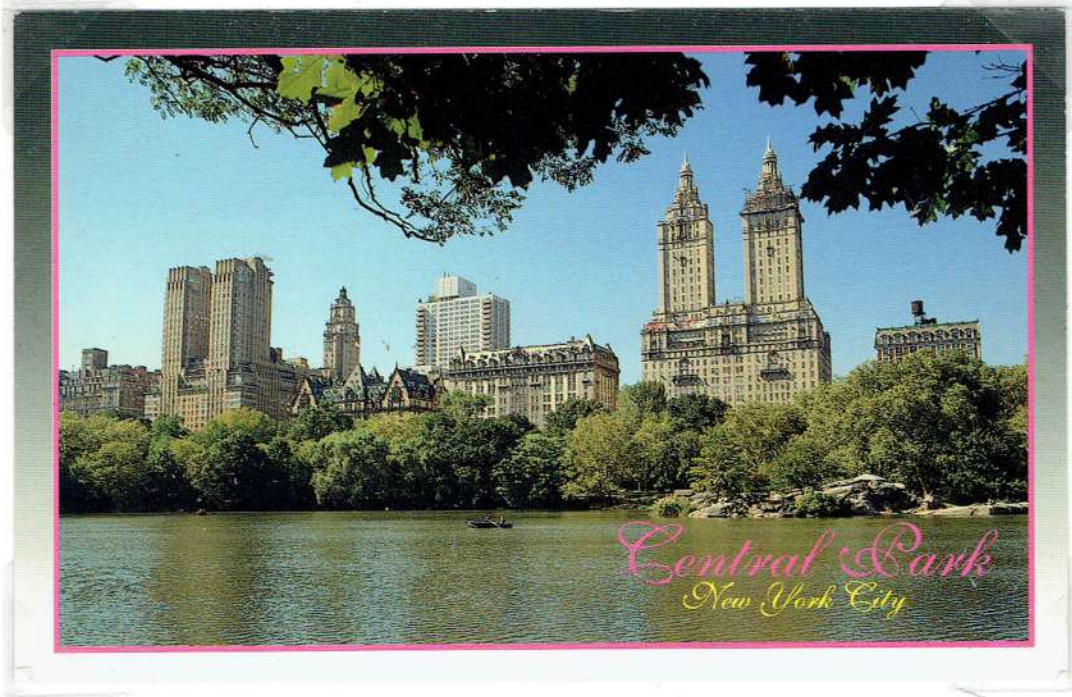

ONE OF THE FOUR GREAT TWIN-TOWERED APARTMENT BUILDINGS THE DEFINE THE CENTRAL PARK WEST SKYLINE. THE MAJESTIC WAS HOME TO WALTER WINCHELL AND MAFIA BOSS FRANK COSTELLO, WHO SURVIVED AN ASSASSINATION ATTEMPT IN THE LOBBY. THE ELEVEN-STORY HOTEL IT REPLACED WAS HOME TO SUCH PEOPLE AS GUSTAV MAHLER AND EDNA FERBER. ITS ROOF GARDEN WAS THE CITY'S MOST FASHIONABLE IN THE 1890'S.

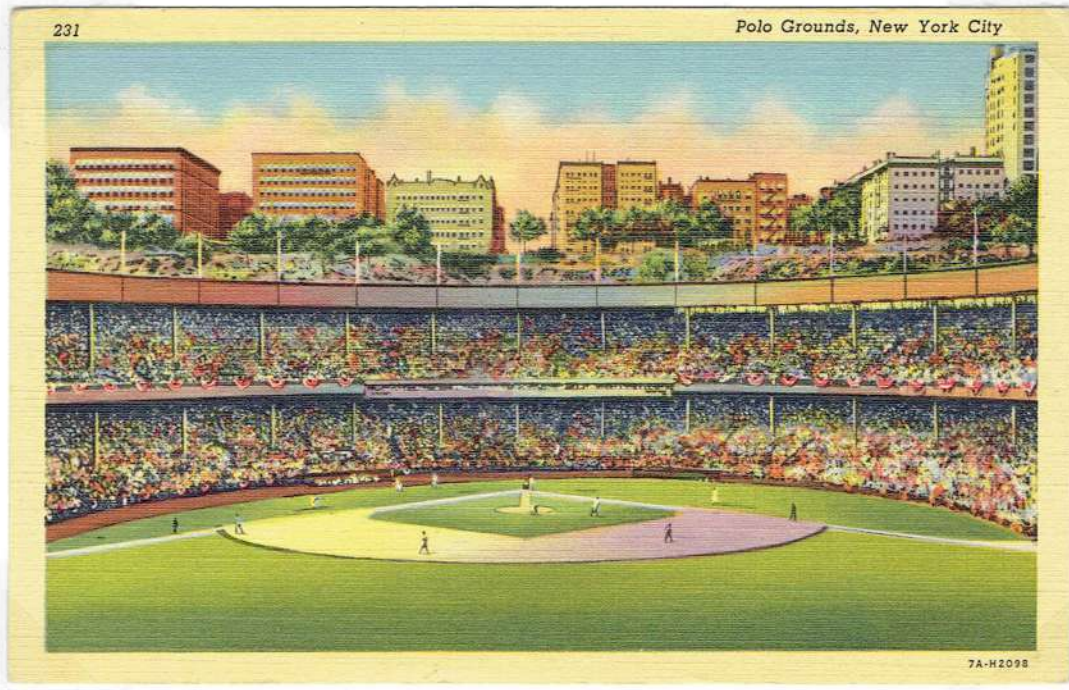

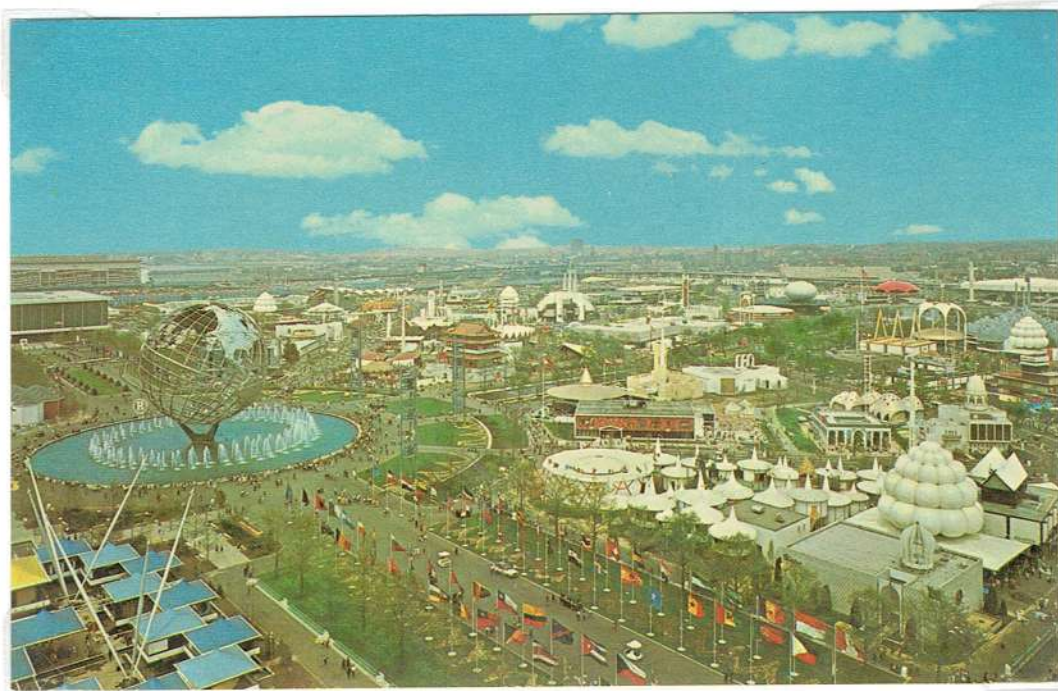
